What's in a smile?

Smiling is attractive and universal. In his travels, Charles Darwin discovered that smiling was the only facial expression which was recognized immediately all over the world.

Smiling is easy to see. It is possible to recognize a smile on someone's face at a distance of 45 metres. You'd have to be much closer to decide whether the person was showing surprise, anger or fear.

Smiling is simple. You use only one facial muscle to smile. To look sad or angry, you need to use at least two muscles.

Smiling is good for you. Studies in the USA have shown that when you smile your heart rate slows down, your blood pressure goes down and the body begins to relax. This happens whether you are feeling happy or not. In fact, if you're feeling unhappy, the simple act of smiling is the first step to feeling better. Once an American journalist recovered completely from a painful and incurable illness just watching the best comedies.

A real smile will usually only last for up to four seconds. False smiles are seen on the faces of politicians who have just lost an election, people who are pretending they're pleased to see you, and door-to-door salesmen. They usually appear slightly too early or too late, and tend to go on for too long.

But if you really want to know if a smile is real or false, look at the eyes. In a false smile these don't change – however much the person has practiced smiling.
